

ASSAP MOPS Telecon Minutes #1

The ASSAP MOPS telecon, on 01 June 2006, started at 2:07 PM (Eastern Time). Roxaneh, chairman, started the meeting with the following agenda:

- Review Action Item log and assign responsibilities
- Review Issues List created by Roxaneh and add to the Action Item log as needed
- Discuss agenda and material to be presented at the next ASSAP MOPS group meeting to be held at RTCA headquarters (Washington, DC) 14-15 June 2006.

1. The group reviewed the Action Item log that was distributed by Roxaneh. The assignee, due data, and open / close fields were updated and reflected in the latest attached Action Item log dated 060106. The comment field also contains the estimated amount of time that it will take to discuss each of the items at the next group meeting. It was decided that these discussions are more appropriate face-to-face at the next group meeting; therefore, these items will be part of the meeting agenda.
2. The group reviewed the Issues List that was distributed by Roxaneh. Roxaneh created this list to keep track of all issues that the group has discussed. The issues that are open were verified to make sure that an Action Item existed. This is reflected in the latest attached Action Item log dated 060106.
3. Roxaneh opened an issue that is now related to Action Item #17 regarding the handling of multiple ICAO addresses. According to discussions with Ken Carpenter at the last group meeting, instances have occurred where more than one aircraft had the same ICAO address in close proximity. The next group meeting will discuss how ASSAP will handle multiple ICAO addresses. ACSS mentioned that requirements may have to be driven back into DO-160A to handle these situations. DO-160A currently expects unique addresses. Since Flight ID, velocity, and quality reports are sent separately from position reports, they may be difficult to associate with which aircraft they came from. UAT does not exhibit this problem since all this information is in the same report.

4. Roxaneh mentioned that Robert will provide a paper and possibly a presentation at the next group meeting on handling multiple ICAO addresses.
5. The next ASSAP MOPS group meeting is scheduled for two full days, 14-15 June 2006, at RTCA Headquarters (Washington, DC). The agenda will include presentations from the Action Item log assignees.
